Two functionalities in one central place:



UK Wider impacts / sustainability

"Wider Effects" as a term is not defined in the UK, although the need to achieve sustainable development in contaminated land management is accepted in policy and regulation.

The 'Model Procedures for the Management of Land Contamination', published by the Environment Agency of England and Wales set out good practice, and can be used across the UK. The wider benefits of remediation projects, and the sustainability of any solutions employed, should be explicitly considered in decision making for contaminated land management. A number of regulatory and planning controls relate to emissions, and wastes generated by remediation, and the planning system can also consider wider impacts such as noise and visual intrusiveness. Cost benefit analysis is seen as an important aid to decision-making and comprehensive stake-holder engagement is encouraged.

Add information

- dissemination tool
- all what you need is a web browser
- immediately within minutes
- User => news, events, project, funding programme, documents, comments, your expertise or your organisation (use the system)
- Country/network/project => new country pages or technical topics (contact us)

EUGRIS Quality assurance

- Content preparation by European experts (content pages) and experts from national agencies and ministeries (country pages).
- 2. External advisory group (representing wide range of end users) secured relevance of information and user-friendly handling of tool
- 3. Visitors can "make a comment" on each page
- Users can submit resources to complete information
- 5. Check of broken links (monthly)

Future of EUGRIS

- Modular structure allows quick integration of new country pages and further technical topics
- International co-operation expands funcionalities (funding database — SNOWMAN, demonstration project database — EURODEMO, online seminars — US EPA)
- New cooperations with projects, countries, networks, experts have to be established to enlarge content — MOKKA
- Targeting on new funding for new funcionalities


User feedback

- Great interest from outside Europe as well, but language remains a barrier
- Linkage of information: e.g., to countries / projects / organisations seen as very useful
- User interest in analyses and cross comparisons of information – additional service?
- But...
 - Original user interface not liked by many, seen as too complicated, "too many things"
 - Search tool approach seen as limited, functionality limited
 - Content seen as limited
- Our self-funded response / "direction of travel" follows



- ...includes recently:
 - >80 general technical information zones
 - 6 country information zones
 - 2,700 resources (documents, software, hardware and web site listings)
 - 51 funding programmes listings and 220 R&D project listings
 - >300 organisations listings
 - >225 current news items as well as conference / training listings
 - A glossary of >500 terms linked to national definitions and translations
 - Around 2,100 registered users from all over the world and many many more casual visitors interested in viewing its content without logging in.
 - (currently 40,000 50,000 sessions per month as of May 2007, which is a high level of traffic, comparable with many commercial portals)


